### 2025: a pivotal year for CSR

The start of 2025 has already seen a number of key events that will impact the course of CSR work.

On the international stage, 2025 marks the decisive halfway point leading to 2030 for the achievement of the 17 United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Signed by all 191 UN member states, they provide a common vision and a guiding framework to uncover possible pathways to sustainability for governments, companies, organisations and individuals alike. It is worth exploring the state of progress on some of the UN SDGs that businesses have been involved in tackling: No Poverty (Goal 1), Quality Education (Goal 4), Responsible Consumption and Production (Goal 12), Climate Action (Goal 13), and Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions (Goal 16).

On Climate Action for example, 2025 marks the pivotal 10th anniversary of the Paris Agreement, which was signed by 189 countries. Today, the decades of climate concerns have lost none of their acuteness. In its sixth assessment report released in 2023, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) outlined how industry emissions led to a 1.1°C increase in current temperatures compared to pre-industrial levels. The report mentions that the 1.5°C target limit above pre-industrial levels is still achievable and that the largest gains in well-being could be obtained by focussing actions on lower income and marginalised communities. At COP29, which was held in Baku in November 2024, the new goal of tripling annual climate finance for developing countries to United States dollar (USD) 300 billion was announced.

This builds on the significant achievements made on global climate action at COP27, which agreed an historic Loss and Damage Fund, and COP28, which delivered a global agreement to transition away from all fossil fuels in energy systems. However, the United States, one of the world's leading greenhouse gas emitters, recently announced its withdrawal from the Paris Agreement and the end of the Green New Deal.

## 2025: The final year of China's 14th Five-year Plan (14FYP)

In China, 2025 also marks the final year of the 14FYP, covering the challenging 2021–2025 period. Alongside the climate crisis, the period has featured considerable geopolitical turbulence, such as the wars in Ukraine and Middle East, and the world was also hit by the Covid-19 pandemic.

In 2020, as the pandemic caused supply chain disruptions and a global economic slowdown, China orchestrated two macroeconomic shifts. First, credit conditions were tightened for the real estate sector, which represented up to 25 per cent of China's gross domestic product (GDP) in the last two decades, triggering a real estate crisis. Second, the transition to net zero became a new driver of China's economic growth. In September 2020, President Xi Jinping announced the dual '30/60 goals' for China to peak its carbon emissions before 2030 and be carbon neutral by 2060. Thus, in March 2021, China adopted the 14FYP focussed on increasing 'high-quality' economic development and consumption. It also featured a particular emphasis on building an 'ecological civilisation'. As an illustration, SKEMA Business School in China highlighted sustainability-related consumption markets such as health and outdoor lifestyle products, which reached a market size of Chinese yuan (CNY) 200 billion in 2023. It also underlined that consumption in China represents just 40 per cent of GDP versus an average 70 per cent in developed countries.

Halfway through the 14FYP, Xie Zhenhua, then China's climate representative, made the point that China could not do without fossil fuels while the technologies, particularly for storing renewable energy, are not mature. Besides, at COP28 China did not sign the global commitment on the tripling of installed renewable energy capacities, the doubling of energy efficiency by 2030 and the end of new coal-fired power stations. This demonstrates China's pragmatic approach to its energy mix, with coal still playing a role alongside renewables. More recently, on 1st January 2025, the Energy Law also came into effect. It describes green and low-carbon energy development as being crucial, due to the country's relative lack of natural resources. It aims to promote renewable energy development, meet energy demand, and develop a safe and efficient energy system. It is also worth noting a document issued on 31st July 2024 by the State Council, which lists significant targets to be hit by 2030 in key areas of green transformation.

### **EU-China cooperation possibilities**

There are areas where the European Union (EU) and China could explore cooperation. Take the development of carbon markets as an example: the EU first launched a carbon market in 2005 and China has been conducting carbon emission trading pilots since 2011. In this regard, the EU and China have much experience to share. In the carbon market, enterprises buy quotas to obtain carbon emission rights for trading, and industries covered by this mechanism have seen faster emission reductions. According to the Climate Action and Environmental Affairs representative at the EU Delegation to China, legislation is crucial for responding to climate change as companies need legal certainty to make investments.

These companies succeed in managing both complexity and uncertainty, and are skilled at using their creativity to design or support innovative strategies that will ensure sustainable economic growth, societal progress and the creation of impactful innovation ecosystems. In this regard, European companies operating in China must continue to play a key role.

In 2025, Siemens will support 100 university teams to benefit more children in remote areas.



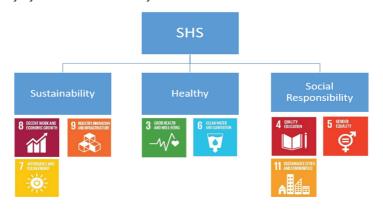

## Green Impact Pioneer Award Bosch Aftermarket

From 2020, Bosch global has already achieved carbon neutral target. We as Bosch Nanjing campus (NjP1) is dedicated to lead the approach as role model. NjP1 is an enterprise with a strong sense of social responsibility and we always focus on green and sustainable development. We use four levers to achieve carbon neutrality:

- Increase energy efficiency
- Use new clean power (direct purchase of renewable energy and self generation)
- Buy in green electricity (I-REC)
- Offset direct CO2 emissions (carbon credits)

First, we established an energy management system that conformed to sustainable development strategies and obtained ISO 50001 certification. Then we Invested in an energy platform to monitor the energy consumption. It provided data basis for analyzing energy efficiency and formulating energy saving measures.

Meanwhile, A 6.9 MWp photovoltaic plant generating green power since 2019 Dec. This is the first photovoltaic project in Bosch China. It provided over 36000 MWh clean power so far. Besides, to offset carbon emissions and supports NjP1 to realize carbon neutralization, we purchased carbon credit.

This year, in order to better absorb clean energy and assist the power grid in load shifting, a new-built 2MW/4MWh energy storage power station has been put into use since 2024 Feb. Energy storage system (ESS) can charge during off-peak or normal time and discharges during peak time of use. It also can store excess renewable energy generated during periods of low demand or high generation, making it available for use when needed.

Finally, in order to achieve coordination and complementarity between solar energy,

energy storage and the power grid, we built NjP1 Micro-grid. Microgrids can control energy storage for charging and discharging according to the power grid conditions, to realize load shifting and assist in the consumption of solar energy, which can ensure the stable operation of the power system and reduce carbon emissions.



## 1.2.2 PHILIPS

## Green Impact Pioneer Award Philips China

### 1. Background

Philips recognizes that circularity is essential for the sustainable use of resources and a prerequisite for decarbonizing in the healthcare industry. In response to sustainability challenges such as climate change, resource scarcity and biodiversity loss, and in line with SDG 12 - Responsible Consumption and Production and SDG 13 - Climate Action, Philips is shifting to a circular model and has set a global target of generating 25% of our revenue from products, services and solutions contributing to circularity by 2025.

#### 2. Content of action

Philips' circular economy strategy can be summarized as follows: Use less, use longer, use again. We recognize that improving resource efficiency requires not only going beyond the design and production of hardware, but also taking an integrated view of devices, services and digital solutions.

Philips practices a circular economy strategy from the top-level design, through the entire product lifecycle, service models and digital tools. We also influence stakeholders, such as supply chain, customers, consumers/patients, government, industry associations, social organizations, etc., to participate in circular economy practices.

#### 3. Action Achievements

The Circular Economy Strategy has achieved significant results since its implementation in 2012. By the end of 2023, 20% sales from products and sevices that contribute to circularity; the operational waste reuse rate is 91%; and zero waste to landfill is realized in all factories.

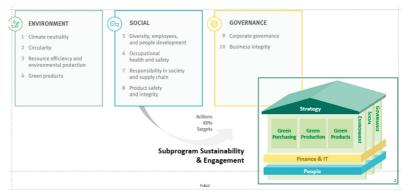

ARKEMA In 2022, Arkema strengthened its commitment from well below 2 °C to 1.5 °C. The Group took its ambition even further in 2023. The new 2030 targets (shown in the figure below), aligned with the 1.5 °C trajectory, have been approved by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi), an independent global body.

The Group's climate plan, aligned with the Paris Agreement, includes mitigation measures across its entire value chain, as well as an adaptation strategy. The SBTi's validation of the Group's ambitious targets, aligned with a 1.5 °C trajectory, paves the way to the achievement of Net-Zero emissions by 2050.

The climate plan is also supported by an increase in investments contributing to the Group's decarbonization, which could reach a cumulative amount of €400 million over the 2022-2030 period and will be included in the Group's recurring capital expenditure envelope.

Moreover, the Group continuously innovates and improves its production processes, implements an ambitious energy efficiency improvement strategy, notably through its Arkema Energy program, and pursues its efforts to purchase energy from low-carbon sources.

In line with the Group's 2030 objectives, each of Arkema's Business Lines has drawn up its own decarbonization plan and trajectory, identifying the necessary industrial projects, improvements or disruptions, as well as low-carbon energy requirements.

In addition. climate issues are taken into account in industrial investment decisions. energy and raw materials supply contracts, as well as the evaluation of acquisition projects.



# 1.3.2

## Climate Action Leader Award **Ericsson**



Sustainability is core to Ericsson's mission and vision and is embedded across our value chain. Ericsson has incorporated environmental sustainability into its business strategy and is driving actions on the pathway to "Net Zero" strategy across whole value chain (from own activities to upstream and downstream scope 3 emissions) by setting

a long-term target to be "Net Zero" across complete value chain by 2040 and aiming to reduce 50% of total GHG emission in the value chain by 2030 based on the 2020 baseline.

So, aligning and fulfilling the "Net Zero" strategy and target of global Ericsson Corporate, Ericsson Nanjing has a new target for own activities to reach "Net Zero" emissions by 2030.



In order to achieve the "Net Zero" target of our own operational activities by 2030, Ericsson Nanjing has greatly promoted the "Net Zero" strategy in all business departments with actions focused on five topics: "Climate action", "Waste & scrap reduction", "Energy efficiency", "LEED gold certification" and "Environment sustainability engagement & competence". A sustainability driver network has been created across the Nanjing site, with environmental education activities and engagement of employees as ambassadors. The sustainability drivers and ambassadors propose, discuss, and foment or implement new innovative projects focused on these five topics.

We have implemented a number of climate action projects across supply chain, design for environment (DfE), production process, warehouse and logistics, material and product scrap recycling, business travel and employee commuting, etc., to reduce CO2e emissions. Such as: smart lighting, solar photovoltaic power, diesel boiler upgrade into steam district heating, green packaging with plastics-free, etc. With the implementation of these sustainability and climate actions projects, we had achieved excellent performance in reducing scrap, improving energy efficiency, promoting the circular economy, implementing green packaging, green logistics, low-carbon transportation, green power, and green commuting.

The CO2e emissions have been decreasing annually, and by 2023, Ericsson Nanjing has reduced its CO2e emissions by 55% compared to the 2020 baseline.



## Fette Compacting

In accordance with the accuracy and completeness requirements of DIN EN ISO 14064-3:2019, TÜV NORD has verified the organizational carbon footprint of FET (China) Pharmaceutical Technology

Co. As an independent certification body, Hangzhou Hande Quality Service Verification of Fette Compacting (China) Co.,Ltd. confirmed that the organization's organizational carbon footprint emissions for the period 01/01/2023 to 31/12/2023 is 3,580.17 t CO2e. Through verification, the statements in the GHG Inventory Report are generally correct and truly reflect the GHG related data and information. In addition, it can be confirmed that the statements in the GHG inventory report are consistent with the ISO14064-1 standard.

ISO 14064 is the international standard for the management of an organization's carbon emissions, including the quantification, reporting and verification of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and removals. It's latest version was published in 2018, marking a further evolution in the global understanding and practice of GHG management. We have taken the following steps at the company level to optimize gas emissions:

- 1. Energy substitution: reducing the use of fossil fuels by substituting natural gas for other fuels, thereby reducing CO2 emissions.
- 2. Adoption of high-efficiency or power-saving equipment: Use of energy-efficient equipment and appliances to reduce energy consumption.
- 3. introduce renewable energy sources: such as wind and solar energy to reduce dependence on fossil fuels.
- 4. Evaluate and promote waste reuse: Reduce the waste disposal load through effective waste management.
- 5. Recycling of resources: Promote the recycling of resources and reduce the exploitation of new resources.
- 6. Water conservation and wastewater reduction: Reduce the wastewater treatment load and reduce environmental pollution. 7.
- 7. Waste reduction: Reduce disposal costs by reducing waste generation in the production process.
- 8. Electricity saving: Reduce electricity consumption through lighting management and summer air-conditioning management.

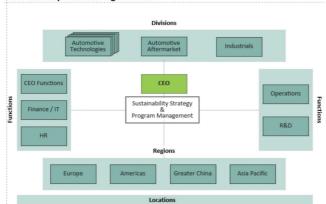

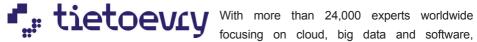

In 2023, average recorded training hours per employee 38.1 hours, spend on learning and development per employee 3200 SEK, 93% employees receiving performance and career development reviews.

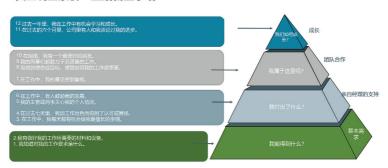
### Employee Development:

## NGO/Social Enterprise-Excellence in Social Innovation Stepping Stones



Stepping Stones is a non-profit organization registered in Shanghai with a mission to improve the education and

general welfare of disadvantaged children in China. We train hundreds of volunteers to teach English, digital literacy, life skills (including social-emotional learning) to thousands of disadvantaged students each week.

In 2016,we implemented an innovative digital literacy/life skills project to support students from disadvantaged communities in China (e.g.,migrant and rural children,and urban children from low-income families). The project provides regular online or offline classes to around 2,500 students annually. We are pleased to report that we have increased our number of beneficiaries by more than 100% over the past two years.

Digital literacy and social-emotional skills are basic for survival in the modern world. Unfortunately, many students in China lack the ability to develop a positive self-image, forge relationships with the people around them, and do not have computers at home or attend schools that do not provide computer classes. Furthermore, due to the context of China's education system - which combines high competitiveness with institutional barriers and limited access to quality education -, many teenagers are entering the workforce at an early age without a high school education, and without the navigational skills necessary to thrive in today's workplace.

By providing digital and life skills, our innovative project aims to prepare them for the future with the objective of improving their self-awareness, social awareness, self-esteem, critical thinking, confidence, and employment prospects in adulthood, and safeguarding them from social harm.

## NGO/Social Enterprise-Excellence in Social Innovation NetSpring



NETSPRING transforms "e-waste into e-education" NETSPRING is a social enterprise pioneer launched in 2012: to build up green IT classrooms

for underprivileged schools. NETSPRING collects and refurbishes old computers, installs and maintains them for 3 years or dismantles those cannot be re-used. NETSPRING team follows-up to ensure that IT resources are used to benefit students and teachers.

2022: In order to actively respond to the epidemic, NETSPRING and PwC volunteers launched the 2nd distance teaching sessions, bringing children specially customized and creative "cloud classrooms" in April, effectively empowering migrant students and left-behind children in mountainous areas.

2023: Netspring launched digital art competition and contributed to Learning Bridge for supporting Special Education Needs (SEN) Youth for the first time in HK. We've also been continuously working on new Green IT Classrooms opening with our supporters Grundfos, Virtuos, etc. We also collaborated with our partners such as UPS China and Colliers to launch volunteering activities successively in China, actively mobilized employees and collected massive obsolete electronic products, brand new computer headphones and spare books to support underprivileged students.

2024: To fight against the digital divide, Netspring dedicates to innovating new courses and coding classes. Besides that, Netspring partners with Grundfos and Robin Charity to launch a new common good initiative in 2024 to enable disabled individuals for future employment. Moreover, we are partner again of the 11th Franco-Chinese Month of the Environment and will hold students' digital art competition.



## NGO/Social Enterprise-Excellence in Social Innovation Wordwise



Wordwise Language Service Platform (Wordwise) has developed the innovative "Translate4Good" initiative, implemented over the past two years. This project combines high-quality language services with a commitment to social responsibility. It focuses on two core elements: developing young language talent and supporting NGOs and social enterprises with pro bono or discounted translation services.

The program addresses the language needs of organizations striving to create social and environmental impact, offering them affordable solutions to expand their global reach. Simultaneously, Wordwise nurtures the next generation of translators by providing practical, hands-on training, helping them gain valuable experience in the field.

Innovative methodologies such as online platforms and collaborative workshops ensure efficient service delivery while enabling trainees to contribute meaningfully to real-world projects. 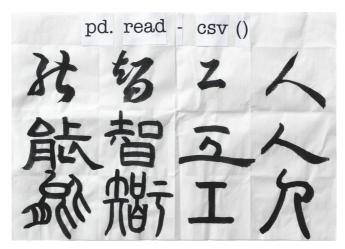
